

Successful Seasons for Men's and Women's Hockey

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As St. Norbert College transitions from winter sports to spring sports, both the men's and women's hockey teams have finished up very successful seasons. They both posted winning records, ranked in the top of the conference, won cup championships, and made it to the NCAA Division III Tournament.

The women's hockey team ended their season with an overall record of 25-5-1 and a conference record of 16-1-1. They also ranked first in their conference. Early in their season, the women's hockey team had an eight match win streak, and they had a nine match win streak at the end of their season. Their biggest win was 8-0 over Marian University. The women's hockey team was the NCHA Slaats Cup champions. They had a 6-1 and 7-2 win over Lawrence University in the quarterfinals, a 3-1 win over Lake Forest College in the semifinals, and an exciting 3-2 win over Adrian College in overtime to win the Cup Title.

The women's hockey team also made it to the NCAA Division III Tournament where they won their first-round game 3-1 over Gustavus Adolphus College. Their season came to an end with a 4-2 loss against Augsburg University in the Tournament. With a very successful season, many Green Knights were recognized with all-conference honors. Courtnie Hogan ('25) was named NCHA Player of the Year, Sydney Zurawik ('28) was named NCHA Co-Freshman of the Year, and A.J. Aitken was named NCHA Coach of the Year. Additionally, Courtnie Hogan, Zurawik, and Natalie Hogan ('25) were named to the All-Conference Team, and Zurawik and Tristan Wicklund ('28) were named to the All-Freshman Team.

The men's hockey team ended their season with an overall record of 24-6-1 and a conference record of 15-3-0. They ranked second in their conference behind Aurora University. The men's hockey team opened their season with a 12 match win streak, and their biggest win was 8-1 over Concordia University Wisconsin. The men's hockey team was Harris Cup champions with a 8-1 win and 2-2 tie with Concordia University Wisconsin in the quarterfinals, a 6-1 win over Trine University in the semifinals, and a 7-4 win over Adrian College in the championship.

The Men's Hockey Team also made it to the NCAA Division III Tournament and picked up a 3-2 win over Gustavus Adolphus College in the first round. They ended their season with a 5-3 loss to Utica University in the quarterfinals. The success of the Men's Hockey Team led to many Green Knights earning all-conference honors. Logan Dombrowsky ('27) was named NCHA Player of the Year, and Dombrowsky, Liam Fraser ('25), Dayton Deics ('26), and Hunter Garvey ('27) were all named to the All-Conference Team.

Overall, both of these teams saw much success in their 2024-2025 seasons, and St. Norbert College is excited to see what they will continue to achieve in the future!
